



WHAT IS THE YMCA OF GREATER TOLEDO?

A key member of the local, national and global communities

Locally (NW Ohio and SE Michigan)

- 1,000 employees in about 30 sites in NW Ohio and SE Michigan
 - 10 family and wellness centers
 - 20 child care centers
 - 1,200-acre outdoor camp in Jackson, Mich.
 - Programs that exist outside our walls, serving those most in need

Nationally

- The YMCA of Greater Toledo is autonomous, but part of YMCA-USA. The national entity is comprised of 2,560 YMCAs, which are located in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico.
- These Ys in turn have facilities in 10,000 urban, suburban and rural communities across the country, serving more than 13 million people of all ages and walks of life.

Internationally

- The YMCA was founded in London in 1844.
- The Y serves more than 40 million people across 120 countries.

WHO IS THE YMCA OF GREATER TOLEDO?

- We are an association of Y staff, members, families, neighbors, partners and donors committed to strengthening our local communities
- We have a second-to-none range of programs that make the Y so much more than a "gym and swim." That said, we focus our programs and efforts in these three areas:
 - Helping kids succeed in school
 - Improving people's health and well-being
 - Bringing people together
- We have a lot of people coming into our facilities more than 100,000 annually – but we also focus on outcomes (more on page x).





YMCA HISTORY

- 1844 Young Men's Christian Association is founded by George Williams in London, England.
- 1851 The first YMCA in the United States is founded in Boston.
- **1865** Volunteers organize a YMCA to help provide positive influence for young men in Toledo.
- **1882** The first home of the YMCA of Greater Toledo is the Hartford building at Summit and Madison.
- 1891 James Naismith invents basketball at the International YMCA Training School in Springfield, Mass.
- 1918 YMCA Storer Camps is founded on 1,200 acres in Michigan's Irish Hills.
- **1920** The University YMCA is organized to benefit students at the University of Toledo.
- **1922** The first International Y's Men's Club is established in Toledo. (Toledo branch, called Y Service Club, restarted in 2022)
- 1928 The Indiana Branch (now Wayman Palmer) is organized to serve Toledo's central city.
- **1950** The Y operates three railroad branches in the Toledo area.
- **1952** South Toledo YMCA is dedicated.
- **1954** West Toledo Y opens and is the first Y in the country to serve families and women.
- **1979** The Eastern and Southwest YMCAs are dedicated. (Southwest is now called Wolf Creek).
- **1982** The YMCA of Greater Toledo begins offering child care.
- 1998 Fort Meigs Center for Health Promotion opens in collaboration with Mercy Health Partners.
- 1999 The YMCA of Greater Toledo affiliates with the Jewish Community Center of Toledo.
- **2001** Youth Opportunities Program (YOP) is established to provide support to disadvantaged youth (changed to YMCA Achievers in 2021).
- **2005** Francis Family Y opens in Temperance, Michigan in partnership with ProMedica Health System.
- **2009** The new West Toledo YMCA opens sharing its campus with Start High School.
- **2015** YMCA Of Greater Toledo celebrates 150th anniversary.
- **2016** Anthony Wayne Community YMCA relocates to 1330 Michigan Ave., in Waterville.
- **2018** Downtown YMCA opens.
- **2019** YMCA marks 175th anniversary of founding in London in 1844.
- **2020** Frank and Shirley Dick Family YMCA (formerly YMCA of Lenawee County) opens new facility in Adrian and officially joins the YMCA of Greater Toledo.
- **2022** Wayman D. Palmer Community YMCA opens a new state-of-the-art fitness center with Peloton[®] bikes and Precor[®] equipment (facility scheduled to be completely rebuilt by 2024).
